Twice in the final moments, Mulvane held the ball with an opportunity to win or tie. Sophomore David Belew drove the baseline behind a screen set by Todd Travis with 16 seconds left but Travis was called for a questionable block. Clearwater made both free throws to take a 52-51 lead. Moments later, a last-chance shot nearly went-but didn't.

Junior guard Kevin Bell had his shooting touch and scored a team-high 18 points. Sophomores Lonny Travis and Belew followed with 12 and 10 points, respectively.

The Clearwater game was the third in the last week for the Wildcats. They evened the season score with Augusta Friday night, Feb. 11, at Augusta, pulling off a 51-46 verdict while one night earlier at Valley Center, the once-beaten Hornets clipped the Wildcats, 76-56.

The 1-2 week saw the Cats' record dip to 5-11 for the season and 3-5 in Chisholm Trail League action, bogging MHS in a three-way battle for third place in the six-team division.

The Cat junior varsity saw its log fall to 2-10 with a 66-35 setback at Clearwater and a 38-37 loss at Augusta.
