Anyway, Landes arrived in time for the delivery and at the other end of the state-it seemed-Landes' Cats were delivering, too. They made it a sweep of Valley by holding on down the stretch, hitting nine of 13 free throws in the fourth quarter to hold off the surging hosts.

The top scorers of a balanced Wildcat offensive were Jason DeWald with 12 points, Steve Nelson with 11, Dan Smith with 10, J.J. Dunn with nine and Jeremy Kendrick with six.

"Going into that game, we knew we had to shoot the ball well early so we could get the lead, and we did," said Landes. "J.J. Dunn, Steve Nelson and Jason DeWald all had a good-shooting first half, but it was our defense that really got us the lead. You have to give the defense credit because we held Valley to under 20 points in the half.

"We went into the game wanting to put pressure on their guards because we didn't feel like they were good ball handlers," added Landes. "We also played a 3-2 zone because we wanted to bottle up their big inside game. That's where they are successful. We didn't feel their outside shooting was that good and everything worked out."

And so did the race to St. Luke's. Landes did a great coaching job, holding hands and helping the breathing, and way up at Valley Center, Scott Swaney did a great job holding the lead.

The Wildcat junior varsity couldn't match the win notched by the varsity and took a 66-49 drubbing. The VC sophomores also had no trouble with the Mulvane sophs, taking a 61-43 verdict.

Griff Cornejo led the MHS jayvee scoring with 13 points. Tom Nienke, Chris Heersche and Shay Vangas each had eight points. For the Mulvane sophomores, James Baker hit double figures with 10 points. Tim Glaser scored nine points, Michael Abasolo had six and Kevin Diller had five.
