Boys Cool Down After Half

For one half, the Mulvane High School Wildeat boys pounded on the door of opportunity, but they couldn't knock it down.

The Cats lost their edge in the third quarter and could do no more than just wave as ranked Circle flashed past them by a 68-52 count Tuesday night, Feb. 16, in a Chisholm Trail League game in Mulvane.

The Thunderbirds used a third-quarter blitz of 22-10 to take the lead, then pulled away in the last quarter. They out-scored Mulvane, 40-19, in the final 24 minutes.

"We cooled off after missing only five shots in the first half," said Cat Coach Rodd Barker. "We were hot but they threw a halfcourt trap at us in the third quarter and that threw us off."

After shooting 75% in the first half (15 of 20), the Cats finished with a 52% mark. The trouble was the T-Birds got hot in the second half and ended up hitting 62% for

the game (26 of 42). "They started shooting better in the second half and we started shooting worse and they just rolled right past us," said Barker.

Randy Johnson was high scorer for the MHS boys, scoring 22 points. Jesse Marksberry finished with 12 points and Jake Wilkinson and Brian Dinkel finished with six and five, respectively.

In the junior varsity contest Tuesday night, Mulvane stalled in the fourth quarter as Circle pulled away, 57-43. Jared Rice and Andy Hixson topped the Cat offensive effort with 12 points each. James MacKay scored seven points and Ryan McKnight finished with four.

The Cat sophomore boys played a preliminary game Tuesday night against Derby and came out on the short end of a 62-54 score. Ryan McKnight and Chris Gerhardt keyed the Mulvane offense with 15 and 11 points, respectively. Andy Hixson had seven points and Brian Love and Jason Wilson scored six points each.

The Wildcat boys were at Valley Center Friday night, Feb. 12, and it turned out to be anything but a show of affection by the hosts. The Hornets turned downright nasty on the Cats and blistered them, 71-33, in a game that really wasn't that close.

"We just never could get anything going," emphasized Coach Barker. "When you get down that quickly, it's tough to get it back together. And when you score only 33 points, you're not going to beat anybody. They were beating us baseline-to-baseline, just pushing it down our throats. They were that good, at least that night."

The Hornets, who boosted their record to 10-7, came out of the locker room smoking. By the end of the first quarter, they were up by six and by halftime, it was 29-15. Actually, the second and third quarters were

crucial. That's when VC stuffed the Wildcat boys by a 35-12 count. Try digging out from under that!

"Valley Center is so much more athletic than we are," said Barker. "They are very athletic. They beat us in just about every aspect of the game. When a team gets on a run like that, it's tough to beat 'em. We changed things up on them early and I thought we had weathered the storm, but they got it right back together and pulled away."

Another key to the victory by Valley was domination on the backboards. The Hornets beat the Cats up worse than anybody has this year. "They really hammered us on the boards," offered Barker. "I think the count was something like 39 for them and 20 for us. It's pretty tough to overcome that much of a rebounding difference. That's part of being athletic, though. They were quicker than we were, they could jump higher than we did and they moved into position around us. It was like they were stepping around our screen-outs and getting under the basket. When they didn't do that, they just jumped higher or went over the top."

The Hornets also put the clamps on Mulvane's No. 1 scorer and the No. 2 scorer in the CTL Division II, Jesse Marksberry. Coming off two straight 25-point games. Marksberry was held to eight points and nobody picked up the slack. Senior Randy Johnson had six points, Jake Wilkinson had five and Jared Rice and and Garrett Hennes had four points each

"We just need to forget this one and go on," noted Barker. "We want to try to finish strong so we can get a home game in the sub-state."

The Wildcats also played junior varsity and sophomore games at Valley Center. The Hornet JVs pounded the Mulvane junior varsity, 74-43, and in a rare sophomore game, Mulvane bombarded the VC sophs, 63-42.

McKnight paced the MHS jayvee boys with 11 points. Nick Pope scored nine points and Jason Wilson scored five.

In the sophomore contest, McKnight dumped in a career-high 21 points. Wilson scored 13 in the soph game, Gerhardt had 10 while Kyle McGuire scored seven.
