## Street MHS Boys Discover

Call it the fickle finger of fate. Call it luck. Call it what you want, but call it a win.

After blowing a victory last week at Buhler by missing critical free throws, the Mulvane High School boys turned the stripe into a friend Tuesday night, Feb. 17, by making eight straight free tosses in the fourth quarter to help quell Wellington, 59-54, in a big Chisholm Trail League victory.

The Cats, improving their CTL stock to 6-2 and 12-5 overall, held off the Dukes with Kyle Steadman making two freebies with 1:19 left, reserve Shay Cornejo for two with 50 seconds left and Curtis Hicks put the toppers on by hitting back-to-back one-and-ones in the last 18 seconds.

"That was the big thing, we made the free throws when we had to," said MHS coach Charlie Mason. "I think playing at home had something to do with us making those and so did the fatigue factor. We had to press so much at Buhler but we really didn't press that much against Wellington."

The Cats took charge against the 6-10 improving Crusaders in the second quarter by out-scoring the visitors, 24-11. Guard Kyle Steadman led the Wildcats with 15 points but he had plenty of help from Morgan LeClair (13 points), Andrew Swayne (12) and Hicks (10).

In the junior varsity outing, Mulvane waltzed to an 84-55 triumph as Shay Cornejo poured through 25 points, Neal Hamilton hit 18 and Huey Nelson had a season-high 17 points.

It was a story of missed opportunities Friday night, Feb. 13, at Buhler. The host Crusaders buffaloed Mulvane, 77-76, in one overtime but the Wildcats missed several chances to ice the game but didn't.

"When you miss the front end of five one-and-ones, you're not going to win the close games," said Mason. "That was the difference. We had our leading scorer at the line with two seconds to go and you figure he's going to knock them in but didn't. We had our chance in overtime, too, but just didn't get the job done and that enabled them to come down and hit about a 25-footer to win

After leading most of the game, Buhler allowed a third-quarter spurt by Mulvane which put the Cats up. Down the stretch, Fox stole an errant Crusader pass with five seconds left and a 69-69 deadlock, Fox was fouled as he reached


