Mulvane recuperated from a bad case of poor playing in the first half by launching its standard comeback using a pressure defense in the second half to overtake Wellington, 49-45, Tuesday night, Feb. 18, in a Chisholm Trail League game.

More importantly, Coach Charlie Mason's boys improved their overall record to 8-9 as the Wildcats scramble for home court advantage in the first-round of the sub-state. In the league, the Cats are 4-4. Wellington dipped to 1-7 in the CTL and 5-11.

· "We missed a lot of shots in the first half (when MHS went seven of 28 from the field) and we tried to give it away in the last two or three minutes," said Mason. "We turned the ball over twice and missed the front end of one-andones three times but came out a winner. You've got to give the kids credit. They were down the whole ball game, like we were at Augusta, but came back and won it. This was a big ball game to win because it gives us a chance to get the home court in the first sub-state game."

The Crusaders were well ahead in the first half before Mulvane mounted a charge in the final 16 minutes. Two free throws by Curtis Hicks with 19 seconds left gave Mulvane some breathing room with a 48-45 lead and Hicks made one of two with six seconds left.

The junior guard finished with his best offense of the season, scoring 21 points. Morgan LeClair scored 12 points and Todd Fox had 10. Andrew Swayne led Mulvane's rebounding with caroms.
