

# Goddard Lions Chew Up Cats

"It was like the battle of Little-Big Horn," said one local fan in describing the Goddard Lions' 97-52 defeat of the Mulvane High School Wildcats on Tuesday.

The Lions, top-ranked in the state, jumped out to a 19-4 first period lead and for all practical purposes, the game was over. By halftime, the Lions, paced by 5-10 Ken Koenigs, had a 48-13 margin. Goddard was ahead 72-26 at the end of the third period. However, in the final quarter, Mulvane poured in 26 points to 25 for Goddard to make the final margin, 97-52.

Brent Fleming led the scoring for Mulvane with 22 points. He was the only Wildcat to hit double figures. The Cats hit 21 field goals out of 51 attempts for 41 percent.
