Boys Dump 2, Eye CTL Title

Mulvane High School's boys will be shooting for the school's first Chisholm Trail League basketball championship since the 1965-66 season at Augusta Friday night, Feb. 22, and Cat coach Charlie Mason is sure they'll have to play better than they did Tuesday night, Feb. 19.

The Wildcats had to struggle with Clearwater before dropping the Indians, 53-52, in a non-conference match-up at home. That improved Mulvane's record to 16-3.

"Clearwater always plays us tough," complained Mason. "We just didn't have the intensity and agressiveness we needed and our delay game almost failed us. We didn't hit the free throws late."

One bright spot was the return to early-season scoring form by senior Greg Quigley, who scored a game-high 20 points. Lonny Travis scored 16 points and guard David Belew finished with 10.

The MHS junior varsity also had a nail-biter with Clearwater before edging the Indians, 55-52, as four players were in double figures. Morgan LeClair scored 12 points and Mike Stump and Kevin Kastl followed with 11 apiece. Curtis Hicks scored 10 points.

The Mulvane sophomores ran their impressive record to 7-4 by blasting the Indian sophs, 77-43. Kyle Steadman was hot, scoring a career-high 18 points. Freshman guards Neal Hamilton and Shay Cornejo were next with 14 and 10 points, respectively. And Lyle Graybeal, a sophomore, also scored 10.

It was "Turnover City" Friday night, Feb. 15, in a Chisholm Trail League game at home against Valley Center. The Cats forced VC into 46 turnovers and routed the Hornets, 62-46, to clinch at least a tie for the CTL Division I championship.

"For the most part, I was satisfied with our zone defense," said Mason. "You can tell from the turnover stats which shows Valley with 46 that our defense was really humming. That's the most turnovers we've forced on one opponent all year, so it should say something about our defense Friday."

Mason also was pleased with the Cat inside game as the 6-foot-5 Huslig and 6-2 Mike Rodgers hustled the backboards, displaying their finest rebounding game of the year. They led Mulvane to a 40-29 edge in rebounds, Rodgers
