Tournament. That tourney is slated to start Thursday, March 3. Pairings won't be announced until Saturday.

Mulvane snapped a six-game win skein by the Crusaders and handed Gayer's troopers only their second loss in 17 outings this season. Ironically, almost one year ago on Feb. 19, 1982, the Wildcats knocked off a state-ranked Buhler squad in Buhler by a 72-71 count in overtime.

"This was the biggest one for us so far this year," said Mason. "Last year, it was a big win for us, too, but then we lost three of our next four. We're hoping that this one will give us the momentum we need."

Behind, 43-42, the Cats rallied by scoring the next eight points. Soptomore guard David Belew, who apprears to be coming into his own, made a steal and a layup to put the Cats on top, 44-43. Junior J.C. Shook followed with another bucket underneath before senior Sid Colliatic, fresh from the bench, made a pair of clutch free throws. Lonny Travis ended the surge with two more free throws with 35 seconds left in the contest, giving the Cats a 50-43 lead. An uncontested shot underneath with one second left by Buhler made it close.

In the first meeting in Buhler, the Crusaders crushed the Cats by 44 points, 92-48. "We were intimidated by them that time," said Mason. "They got us down and rubbed our noses in it."

Belew finished with a game-high 17 points. Travis finished with 11 points

and 10 rebounds. L. Travis scored eight. Tuesday was another nailbiter for the Wildcats. Behind, 56-55, the Cats had several chances to go ahead but blew them until T. Travis rebounded a missed Belew free throw and put it back in with 15 seconds left. Two shots by the Trojans in the final three seconds

Belew bombed away for a career-high 20 points and T. Travis and junior guard Kevin Bell added 12 points apiece.

Mulvane's junior varsity also nipped Andover by one, 48-47, as Greg Quigley, Terry Reusser and Aaron Huslig combined for 32 points. The Cats also prevailed, 44-36, in a freshman-sophomore game as Mike Rodgers and Jamie Lough split 16 points.
