"For the most part, we played well," said Mason. "We didn't get any breaks from the officials, which you never do when you go to Buhler. They beat our pressure time and time again and their spacing made it difficult to trap. We had to start fouling late in the fourth quarter and they shot the free throws in."

The Wildcat guys were sluggish at the beginning, falling behind, 7-0, before scoring and that gave the Crusaders the opportunity to expand their lead to as much as 15 in the opening half. But by halftime, the Cats had worked the game back to a three-point margin, trailing, 39-36.

"We even took a three-point lead in the third quarter but they hit a couple of three-pointers to regain the lead and that was that," said Mason, who noted it was one of those bitter-sweet games. "I was a little disappointed because I thought they were ripe to be beaten. Valley Center beat them and they only beat Augusta and Andover by about eight, so it was a ball game we could have won. On the other hand, we played pretty good basketball for the most part."

It's just tough to beat the Crusaders in Buhler. "That was probably the best game Buhler has played in their last four or five games," said Mason. "We played better than we did at Goddard but we were playing better people."

Senior Shay Cornejo led all scorers with 28 points and senior Larry Lambrecht scored 20 points. Toby Butcher finished with 14 points despite sitting out the first quarter of the game, and John Melick finished with seven points.

"I'm real pleased with Lambrecht, he had an excellent game," stressed Mason. "He had four three-pointers. Neal Hamilton also had a ball game. He had 14 assists and that's probably as many as anybody's had here in quite a few, years in one game."

The Wildcat junior varsity also had its hands full, bowing in a 76-55 game to the Crusaders.

John Heinrichs continued to find the ring, scoring 20 points. Mike Higgins scored 10 points and Andrew Hodges and Mark McClellan were next with nine and six points, respectively.

Mulvane's sophomore team closed its season with a 42-38 loss to the

Crusaders. Coach Dale Landes' club finished 4-8 this season.

Bruce Brashear and Andy Church split 14 points equally for the Cat sophs. Curtis Norden, Sean Young and Bill Harrington had six points each.
