Boys Gather Momentum

Building momentum is something Mulvane boys basketball coach Charlie Mason has talked about all season. It's been difficult with the 4-13 record the Wildcars have posted this season, but Mulvane took the first step toward any "momentum" heading into post-season play Friday night, Feb. 20, by dumping Andover, 56-47, at home.

The Cats took a step backwards four nights later when Buhler nipped Mulvane with a come-from-behind effort to win, 51-42, in a make-up game Tuesday. It was the final Chisholm Trail League Division I game and MHS closed out its league season with an 0-8

Against Andover, though, the Wildcats put it together for a homecoming victory, their first in six seasons. After a rocky start (Andover grabbed a 16-8 first-quarter lead), the Wildcats were in command.

"When it gets down toward playoffs, they are all big games," said Mason, who has seen his club continually improve all season. "We were really fortunate to be out front as far as we were against Andover because we missed 10 one-and-ones in the fourth quarter.'

Mason also praised the Wildcat defense in the final three quarters and cited domination on the backboards as critical to the Andover victory. The Cats took a 40-27 edge in rebounding, with 6-foot-3 senior Kevin Burke leading the club with 10 rebounds and Darryl Brueggeman and 6-5 sophomore David Hagerman with nine and eight, respecrively.

Buhler had to rally in the fourth quarter to preserve a share of the CTL title after Mason's scrappers pulled
