Against Valley, Mulvane rolled out to a 24-7 first-quarter advantage and never looked back. Senior Mark Storey scored a season-high 26 points and had plenty of help in the scoring column from Mark Smith's 17, guard Jeff Staska's 15 and Ed Nelson's 12.

At Andover, Nelson finished with 18 and Smith with 12 to head the Wildcat scoring.

Mulvane's B-team remained on the skids, losing to Valley Center, 63-46, and Andover, 59-40.

Balanced scoring prevailed against Valley, with Tim Warren and Mark Fox each scoring nine points. At Andover, Brent Iverson topped the Cats with 11 points and Fox finished with six.

The Wildcats will close out the regular season at home Friday night, Feb. 29, entertaining Circle. It'll be both homecoming and parents' night.
