## 'Senior Night' Wildcat Style

It was "Senior Night" at the Mulvane High School gym Tuesday night and Charlie Mason wanted all the seniors on the Wildcat boys basketball squad to have the limelight wash down on them. 'These seniors, all eight of them, have

accomplished something that we may never see again and I wanted a kind of 'Senior Night' for them," said Mason. "You know, these kids haven't lost a home game in two years and I feel that's quite an accomplishment. All eight should be proud of that fact as well as all the other accomplishments they've been involved with.' The eight closed out their playing

careers on the Mulvane hardwoods Tuesday night, Feb. 26, by pounding Augusta into submission, 86-61, in the first round of the Augusta Class 4A Sub-State Tournament. First round games are played on the home floors of the top four seeded teams. The victory was the 18th in a row at

home for Mulvane, the last MHS home loss coming in the 1982-83 season against Wellington, 56-54. More importantly, it provided the

Wildcats a first step toward defending their Class 4A state championship. They now will meet Rose Hill (12-9), an upset winner Tuesday night over No. 3 seeded Circle, at 8 p.m. Friday night, March 1, in a sub-state semifinal. The boys championship game will be at 8 p.m. Saturday, March 2. The beautiful thing about Tuesday night's shellacking of Augusta was that
