close as El Dorado danced into Friday night's semifinal round with a 65-29 trouncing of the Cats.

The loss ended the first year of the John Darrow Era. Mulvane posted a 2-19 record. El Dorado advanced hoping for another shot at the 4A State title which eluded it last year when they finished second at State.

"They came out and proved why they were the No. I seed (in the sub-state)," said Darrow. "They put a press on us and they have so much quickness, so much athletic ability and so much height, it just overwhelmed us. They also are well coached. El Dorado just stuck it to us from the beginning."

There wasn't much of an ending in this game, only a beginning. The El Dorado Wildeats had Mulvane bombed by intermission, 47-7, and Darrow used the second half as a schooling period for many of his younger, less experienced players.

Senior Jesse Marksberry closed out his prep career by pacing the Cats in the offensive department, hitting for 14 points. Jason Wilson finished with five points and Shane Webster, Jonathan Reed and senior Jared Rice scored two points apiece.

It's not how Darrow wanted the script to read, but Kingman was reading from a different script Thursday night, Feb. 24, in the regular season finale for both teams. The Eagles scorched the Wildcats with a make-shift line-up on their home floor, 79-35, ending the regular season on the last of a series of sour notes.

After playing one of their finest games a week earlier at home against Rose Hill when the Cats avenged a 54-7 beating by blasting Rose Hill by 17 points in the return match. Mulvane was overwhelmed by the Eagles, who clinched a tie for first place in the Chisholm Trail League Division II with the win

The Cats had Marksberry scoring 14 points. Two freshmen were next in line. Jimmie High and Caleb Alexander scored three points each.

The Cat junior varsity team was buzzed in its last three games, finishing the season with a 2-12 record for Coach Gregg Wolgast. Kingman ended Mulvane's JV season with a 79-35 thumping. Andale's jayvees roared past the Cats, 64-47, and Rose Hill played a steady game to dump Mulvane, 54-43.

Against Kingman, the Wildcat JV offensive lead came from Reed's nine points and four each from Jeremy Adams, Webster and Shawn Rogers.

High scorer for Mulvane against Andale was big Ryan McKnight 17 points. Reed dumped in 12 points and Adams finished
