Mulvane Takes CTL Championship

Wildcat-Boys Into Semifinals

Mulvane High School's boys overcame a mediocre effort in a third game this year against Augusta to budge past the Orioles, 53-49, in the first round of the Augusta Class 4A Sub-State played in Mulvane.

The No. 2 seeded Wildcats needed a good pass from Kyle Steadman from back court to Andrew Swayne under the Cat basket, which resulted in a three-point play and gave Mulvane the breathing room it needed to hold on against the scrappy Orioles, who ended their season at 7-14.

"We could have been in trouble if Steadman hadn't gotten that pass to Morgan for the three-pointer," admitted Mason. "That first (sub-state) game is always the hardest. We anticipated a tough game because it's hard to come back and play somebody three days after you beat them soundly."

Mulvane led most of the first half but went stale in the third quarter as Augusta reeled off nine points to take a 40-36 lead. The Cats pushed ahead barely but two missed free throws and a couple turnovers put the game on the line at 50-47 with one minute to play. That's when Steadman found LeClair under the Mulvane basket with a half-court pass. Swayne dumped it in and was fouled. The three-point play

The 16-5 Wildcats will advance to the semifinal round in the sub-state at 8 p.m. tonight (March 5) when they tangle with Maize (15-6) at Augusta High School. The other boys semifinal finds No. 1 seeded Circle (18-2), a 72-54 winner Tuesday night over Lindsborg, going against Clearwater (12-9), at 8 p.m. Friday, March 6, Clearwater eliminated Rose Hill, 59-42.

The Wildcats had their usual balanced scoring, although both Todd Fox and Curtis Hicks both had off nights. LeClair scored 14 points, Andrew Swayne popped in 13 and both Fox and Steadman joined in with 10 points apiece.

Mulvane captured the Chisholm Trail League Division I championship Friday night, Feb. 27, when the Cats battered Augusta, 69-47, at Augusta. That gave Mulvane coach Charlie Mason his 100th career victory in Mulvane and also the CTL title with an 8-2 record, one game better than runner-up Buhler (7-3).

Fox pumped in a game-high 27-points, Hicks scored 12 and LeClair had 10 for Mulvane.

The Mulvane junior varsity also posted a winner, 66-53, and so did the Cat sophomores by a 56-55 count.

For Coach Bruce Eitzen's varsity, Shay Cornejo continued his torrid scoring with 22 points but Neal Hamilton took game honors with 23 points. Huey Nelson and Russell Norden had six points apiece.

For the Mulvane sophs, Sean Gillespie gunned in 18 points, Larry Lambrecht scored 15 and John Heinrichs added 12 in their final outing of the year.
