Junior center Andrew Swayne had a day, a "career day," well, let's just call it a "life-time day" Tuesday, March 4, in the opening round of the Augusta 4A Sub-State played in the Mulvane High gym.

Swayne poured through 31 points as the Wildcats blew past Wellington, 71-59, behind a second half outbreak after a tie game in the first half. It was the third straight victory over the Crusaders this year for Coach Charlie Mason's Cats and marked the first time this season Mulvane has been over the .500 mark (11-10). Wellington's year ended at 7-13.

"They tried to deny the ball to Todd and over-shifted too much, and that opened up the middle," said Mason. "And with Morgan out, Andrew had a field day. He knocked down everything he threw up. He had a great game."

With Swayne drilling 12 points in the second quarter alone, the Cats were able to hang on for a 29-29 halftime tie before the Wildcats slowly surged into as much as an 18-point lead in the third quarter, then put the game away in the final period by hitting their free throws.

"We did a good job getting the ball inside," said Mason. "We knew they would have to do something with Todd, especially since he came out and made his first three shots and that gave Andrew an opening and he took advantage of it."

With leading scorer Morgan LeClair hampered after picking up three first-quarter fouls. Swayne went to work, scoring his career-high 31 points. Fox finished with 15 points and Curtis Hicks had nine. LeClair was held to four points, one less than reserves Bryson Butts and Nick Fortin.

"We started pulling away in the third quarter when we went from full-court to half-court pressure and that helped force them to take some poor shots," said Mason. "And in the fourth quarter, when we went to the line, we put them in. Nick (Fortin) came in and did the job and so did Curtis (Hicks) when we needed the free throws."
