The Mulvane Wildcat boys are missing the rest of the sub-state dance tonight and Saturday because Andale had the golden touch in opening round action in the Augusta Class 4A Sub-State.

The Indians shot 73% from the field in the first half and finished with a 67% mark as they steamrolled the Wildcats at home, 86-58, to advance to the semifinal round tonight (March 6) against Rose Hill. It was the third straight Andale win over Mulvane

this season.

Coach Todd Barker's Wildcats ended their season at 5-16. "They only missed two shots in the first quarter," pointed out Barker. "They just never cooled off. I don't know what got them all worked up for us, but they didn't miss."

Actually, the Wildcats didn't play that badly, according to Barker. "I thought we played a pretty good ball game," said Barker. "It's just next to impossible to beat somebody hitting that good. We tried numerous defenses and it only slowed them down until the next string of baskets."

The Cats even beat the Indians on the boards, 31-26, but nothing seemed to shake the host Andale team, which improved its record to 17-4. Mulvane rebound leaders were senior Neil Gosch with six boards and

senior Raymond Lazier and juniors Darrin

Erbert and Dan McElroy with four apiece.

"we had some turnovers from mental errors that hurt us, errors that weren't forced, but we didn't play that poorly," added Barker. "They just played way above what you would expect."

Erbert closed out a fine junior season, scoring a game-high 17 points. Lazier pumped in 12 points in his final game, Bryce Schumacher had 10 points and Gosch and Sean Holman scored six and five,

respectively.

in the regular season finale at home against Circle. The Division II regular season champs put the hammer down on the Wildcats and ran away with a 70-45 mugging. That left the Cats at 4-8 in the CTL and in sixth place.
