

District Tournament Won By Mulvane

Mulvane cinched their entrance into the regional tournament here Friday night. They were awarded the first place trophy for defeating Oxford 43-35.

Webster scored 10 points in the first half with Glaser and McCurdy each scoring 6 and Galvan 4. This brought the score to 27-21 at the half way mark. In the third and fourth stanzas Galvan scored 6 points, McCurdy 4, Butts 3, Glaser 2, and Young 1 to bring the final score 43-35.

Mulvane's Wildcats have been able to score only 43 points from Oxford in each of the three games played this year.

The first game of the finals was between Andover and Douglass. The teams were very evenly matched and the score was tied several times but Douglass came out on top with a score of 35-25. The half time score was 14-12 with Andover leading. Polk for Douglass and Timmons for Andover were high point men with 16 points.

The second game of the semi-finals Thursday was played by Mulvane and Andover. Mulvane led all the way and the half time mark showed Mulvane leading Andover 24-17. In the third and fourth quarters Mulvane scored 10 field goals and three charity shots to add up the score to 47-39 when the final "shot was fired" by the timer. Mr. Lee Doyen, McCurdy and Timmons took the honors for the two teams each scoring 16 points.

In the semi-finals Oxford met Douglass and Oxford proved victorious over the Bulldogs by doubling Douglass' score 42-21. High point man was Poovey for Oxford with 11 points and Polk for the Bulldogs with 7 points.

Mulvane and Derby played in the fourth game of the tourney Wednesday and Mulvane led all the way. The half time score was 36-13 with Mulvane more than doubling Derby's score. The final score was 66-29 with Mulvane the victors. Webster and Glaser tied for high point honors with 14 points each. Brown was high point man for Derby with 12 points to his credit.

In the third game of the tourney, Andover defeated Belle Plaine 33-29. This was one of the closest games of the tournament with Andover leading at the half by a narrow margin of 5 points 20-15. Timmons was high point man for Andover scoring 5 points and Smith took the honors for Belle Plaine with 9 points.

Douglass defeated Rose Hill in the second game of the tourney by a score of 40-34. Valentine was high point man for Douglass counting 12 points. McMurphy paced the Rose Hill team with 14 points.

The first game of the tournament was played Tuesday by Udall and Oxford. Udall was edged out of the tourney by a score of 55-30. Nicholson was high for Oxford with 18 points and Frank Newman led Udall with 11 points.

Oxford's victory over Douglass gave them the second place trophy and Douglass won the third place trophy.
