When the guy in the striped shirt puts the palm of his hand against the tops of his fingers on the other hand, it's "T" time, and Friday night, Dec. 4, in the season opener at home against Andale, the "T" spelled victory for Andale.

Mulvane High School's boys basketball squad started its season Friday on a sour note, losing a 62-58 thriller to the visiting Indians. The game was a non-league encounter.

"Naturally, you hate to lose any game but especially one like that," said Mulvane's veteran coach Charlie Mason, "For most of the game, we played as good on the basketball court as I expected. I was just disappointed in the outcome, disappointed in the way the outcome came down. That was one thing we talked about before the ball game, keeping our composure and doing things that we're supposed to do to win games, not worry about the officiating.''

That thought went out the front door in the fading seconds as the Wildcats successfully blew a seven-point lead in the final quarter. Some shoddy passing helped the Indians to cut the gap, then take a one point lead, 58-57, with about 1:30 left in the game. A missed opportunity followed for Mulvane, forcing Mulvane into a gambling mode in an attempt to get the ball back. A foul was called, then a technical foul on senior Toby Butcher, giving Andale two free throw chances plus the ball. That occurred in the final 10 seconds.

"The 'T' was the deciding factor," said Mason. "They just changed that rule this year so that on any technical, other team gets two Previously on a technical by a player, they got only one shot. Anyway, they missed the first one but we didn't have time to get the ball back and score twice. Everybody was trying so hard to get the ball back, pressuring them, that they were able to go over the top for a lob and an easy lay-up." The game was a nip-and-tuck situation
