

Wildcat Boys Still Looking

The shot chart says one thing, the scoreboard another. Trouble is, when the buzzer goes off, only the scoreboard counts.

Mulvane got its shots but they wouldn't fall Tuesday night, Dec. 9, and Maize rode the crest of a 23-point burst from senior Bill Hayford to a 66-52 victory over the Wildcats.

The loss, coupled with a 50-37 beating administered at home by Kingman Friday night, Dec. 5, dropped Mulvane's record to 0-3 heading into Friday night's game at Clearwater.

"We were again plagued by our own mistakes," complained Cat second-year coach Charlie Mason. "Until we eliminate some of those (mistakes), we're going to have some problems. Shooting the ball, we hit 34 percent and that's an improvement from the Kingman game, but it's tough to win shooting 20 out of 58."

Maize broke out to a 21-8 lead early in the second period before Mulvane rallied to within seven points. "We got back within seven points and could have made it five, but we made a mistake or had a mental lapse," said Mason. "We couldn't get over that hump."

Senior Kevin Burke finally found his scoring touch against Maize. He led the team with 15 points and Brent Iverson and Marc Huslig, both seniors, added 11 and 10 points, respectively. Burke also led the club in scoring against Kingman with 12 points.

Mason said there were some bright spots. Burke's offensive improvement the last two games, Huslig finally getting to play after an injury, junior Tim Warren coming off the bench with
