Cats Chasing Maize Repeat

When strength matches weakness, it doesn't take a genius to figure out what happens. Mulvane High School's boys basketballers opened defense of their Maize Boys Invitational championship Tuesday afternoon, Dec. 11, from a point of strength.


A Wildcat strength is quickness and pressing, and those two factors worked well against Valley Center's inexperienced backcourters. The Wildcats broke ahead, 17-10, in the first quarter and dominated Valley in the tourney opener, 87-54.

That win, running the club's record to 3-0, advanced Coach Charlie Mason's Cats into a semifinal game at 6 p.m. Friday, Dec. 14, against Nickerson, a 59-36 winner over Andale.

"We got off to a real good start, then just kind of kept it going," admitted Mason. "We pressed and they turned it over. We felt like they were awfully weak at guard and wanted to try to take advantage of that. They are inexperienced there and we felt like we could take advantage of it."

It also didn't hurt the Cats to dominate the boards as Valley tried a three-guard game to counter-act Mulvane's pressing defense. "We were able to dominate the boards then," said Mason. "If we missed a shot, someone was there to get the offensive rebound and put it back up. Several times, we got three or four shots and once I can recall us getting seven shots before we made it."

The only two areas of concern for Mason were on defense and at the free throw stripe, where Mulvane had another poor showing, making only 11 of 25. "We still need to work a lot defensively," said Mason. "I'm not satisfied with it right now, especially

Senior Greg Quigley helped lead the Cat scoring, hitting a career-high 23 points, 17 coming in the first half. Senior Lonny Travis had his second straight big game, scoring a game-high 24 points, and guard David Belew added 13 points. Reserve Mike Rodgers
