

Mulvane Limp Home After Goddard Sweep

Mulvane High School's boys basketball team limped home from Goddard Friday night, Dec. 8, with three losses and Wildcat coach Roger Pock trying to look on the bright side.

"We had some things to cheer about," insisted Pock. "I thought (guard) Tom Fagan and Courtney Gammon were consistent. I thought they both played well all night. And Grant Sorensen came off the bench and picked the team up."

But it wasn't enough picking up. Goddard, with Stan Weber scoring 17 points and 6-foot-5 David Taliaferro adding 23, wrapped up a comfortable 64-47 victory over Mulvane.

The Goddard B-team plastered the Wildcats, 74-43, and the Lions' sophomore quintet reeled in a 64-34 victory.

The A-team loss dropped the Wildcats' record to 0-2 heading into Friday night's home opener against Augusta (1-1) in a Chisholm Trail League game.

Pock singled out poor offensive output in the early going, leading to a 20-6 lead for the Lions in the first quarter. "We didn't score the first four and one-half minutes of the ball game," said Pock. "Only shot about six times and couldn't get anything to go down."

shots but they wouldn't fall. Several were tip tries. It was just one of those nights when you can't get it to fall early."

Overall, the Wildcats' offense, so far a semi-bright spot for the Cats, perked up, hitting 47.8 percent from the floor in the game. "Goddard just got the big lead, then coasted in," said Pock.

The Wildcats made a mild comeback in the third and fourth quarters, getting with nine points twice before the Lions geared back up. Fagan and Gammon fuelled that comeback, along with Sorensen.

Courtney, a 6-3 junior frontliner and the club's No. 1 scorer after two games, finished with a team-high 19 points -- nine points coming in the final stanza -- and Fagan added 14. Sorensen finished with six.

"Everybody likes to see a winning game every time but I'm more concerned with progress," added the Wildcat boss. "I think we're coming. Our offense has been good all along. The defense came a long way from the other night (in a loss to Cheney). I'm looking for improvement. I want to peak at the end of the year."

The Cats' B-team also got off to a slow start, as the Lions roared out to a 15-8 lead, then upped that to 36-23 at intermission.

Greg Hamilton, a sophomore, led the Mulvane scorers with 11 points and three players finished with eight points each -- Troy Phillips, Troy Dossey and Ed Nelson.

Darryl Brueggeman's eight points and six by Gary Elston and Greg Cox topped the Mulvane sophomore effort.
