Cat Boys umped At Circle; Free Throw Difference

For the Mulvane High School boys basketball team, the number seven is not so lucky. The Wildcats have lost two of their three games in the last week by seven points.

Mulvane also has had enough of Circle High School to last them a while, thank you. Coming off two losses to finish last in Circle's Thunderbird Classic, the Wildcats had to return to Circle to take on the home team. A team ranked in the top ten of Class 4A.

Mulvane lost a battle to Circle Tuesday, Dec. 13, by a score of 59-52.

"We did do some good things," MHS basketball coach Dale Landes said. "It just came down to a half-dozen plays we didn't execute.

Landes mentioned a 6-0 Circle run before halftime and the start of the fourth quarter specifically where it seemed his team did not finish the plays. "We did make better decisions most of the time, but we just couldn't make the plays," Landes said.

The real story of the game came at the free-throw line, though. Circle was 21 of 29 from the stripe, while Mulvane could only manage a paltry 2-7. It was a 19-point advantage for the Thunderbirds.

"Good teams do that, they get to the line and make them," Landes said.

The Wildcats could take solace in the fact that they didn't let the bigger Circle players dominate the game.

"We did a good job in our zone until we were forced to press," Landes said. "A loss is still a loss, though, and Circle knew how to do enough to win."

Senior Dexter Carpenter paced the Cat offense, scoring 15 points. Guard Jeremy Brown had 11 points, Tim Glaser scored eight and Michael Abasolo finished with seven.

It was another good effort that kept Mulvane in the game against Andover Thursday, Dec. 8, in the second round of the Thunderbird Classic. The Trojans pulled away to win, 65-58.

"We played extremely well except for a few mental lapses that ended up costing us the game," Landes said.

The teams were knotted at 24 after the first half. "We were more aggressive against Andover," Landes said.

In the second half, Andover kept creeping out ahead, little by little. "We started to turn the ball over, lost our focus and let the game slip away in the third quarter," added Landes.

Mulvane did have two players in double figures as Abasolo finished with 14 points and Carpenter netted 11. "That is the type of scoring we need from both of them every game," Landes said.

The Wildcats had pretty good production from their bench in players like Brad Canfield and Sean Younger.

"Brad is learning on the job, learning to be more aggressive," Landes said.

The game did give the Wildcats a close game to work in for the first time. "We are learning and we saw we needed to improve in crucial situations," Landes said.
