

Mulvane Downs Valley Center 42-35

The Mulvane Wildcats chalked up another victory for their third straight win Friday night, Dec. 10 when they won over Valley Center, 42-35 in the first basketball game in the new gymnasium.

It was a close game all the way, with Mulvane not hitting as well as they did in their last two games. The Wildcats made 18 per cent of their baskets while Valley Center hit 29 per cent.

At the end of the first quarter, Mulvane was lagging behind Valley two points, with the score being 9-7. Valley still had a two point lead at the end of the half, 18-16.

The locals had captured the lead, 31-27 by the end of the third quarter, for their first real lead. Since their hitting average was low, the Mulvane quintet played a delayed ball game during the fourth quarter. Mulvane controlled the ball for five minutes, 23 seconds, during which time they scored ten points, mostly on free throws, while Valley was able to score only four points.

Webster was high point man for Mulvane with 17 points with Dickey second high with 14.
