The Wildcats played their best game of the season Tuesday at Circle but lost it in overtime as the host Thunderbirds held on for a 58-49 decision.

Circle tied the game in the final minute on two free throws then out-scored the Cats, 11-2, in the extra period.

"We played pretty well the whole game, though," pointed out Landes, who had been looking for something to be encouraged about. "We didn't play well in the overtime because we didn't score in our first two possessions and they did. That put us back on our heels the rest of the way and we had to foul. They put the ball in Casady's hands and he went seven-for-8 in overtime. I feel the early possessions in overtime are extremely important and we couldn't get the shots to go down."

The loss dropped the Wildcats to 0-3 for the year as they head into the next round of the round robin tournament against Independence in an 8:15 p.m. game tonight (Dec. 17). The last round of the tournament will be played Saturday, Dec. 19. The 5th place game will take place at 5 and 3rd place will be decided at 6:30.

"We had three opportunities in the last few seconds to win it in regulation but the shot wouldn't go down," said Landes. "We called a time out with 26 seconds left so we could set up one play. We got the play run perfectly but J.J. (Dunn) spotted Brian Strack low and passed it instead of shooting it. Brian Heinrichs got a shot, Jason DeWald missed a rebound shot and so did Brian. We thought their might have been some fouls in

there but nothing was called."

Landes was most happy with the overall effort, though. "I thought the team showed a lot of guts and determination," said Landes. "We led, 14-9, after one quarter but didn't score again until the last three minutes before halftime. We were still up, though, because our defense came through. We came out in the third quarter and were really flat but battled with them and hung right in there. We had a couple of defensive breakdowns in overtime that hurt, but overall, I would have
