## Mulvane Boys Play for 7th

Defense is getting the Mulvane High School Wildcat boys into hot water. The Cats had trouble stopping Circle Tuesday night, Dec. 17, in a consolation semifinal in the Thunderbird Boys Classic at Circle and were swamped by a 79-42 count.

That puts Mulvane into the 7th place game at 4:30 p.m. Friday afternoon, Dec. 20, against Rose Hill.

"We're not playing well defensively," said Mulvane Coach Charlie Mason. "We're not getting the job done on defense. We can't stop anybody. That was understandable Monday night against Ark City because they are a super team, but not against Circle."

The host Thunderbirds broke the game open early, scoring 28 points in the second quarter to take a 42-18 halftime lead. "Not being able to defense anybody hurts because it puts more pressure on the offense to perform," said Mason. "We're not shooting the ball well, either. When you get the ball in the paint so many times but you can't put it down, you wonder what you have to do to score."

Mason did see some improvement Tuesday night in overall play. "It may not have looked like it by the score, but we did play a lot better against Circle," noted Mason. "We did score more points (a season-high 42), we had some people play better ball and we ran our offense better."

Mulvane's top gun was junior J.J. Dunn, who was blanked the night before against tall Ark City. He had 13 points against Circle. Brian Heinrichs scored six points, Steve Nelson, five, and Larry Dixson, Jarrod Oldridge and Brian Strack, four apiece.

What happens when a powerhouse runs into a struggling team? The Cat boys found out Monday night, Dec. 16, in the opening game of the Thunderbird Boys Classic at Circle High School.

Highly-regarded Arkansas City buried the Wildcats, 67-23, the 3rd straight loss this season for Coach Mason's team.
