Cat Boys Take 7th At Maize; Take 1-4 Record Into X-Mas

Even when you win, you lose. That's the situation Mulvane High School basketball coach Charlie Mason and his Wildcats were in in the seventh place game Saturday, Dec. 17, in the Maize Boys Invitational Tournament.

Mulvane posted its first victory of the year as the Cats sent the Andale junior varsity tumbling by a 70-54 score.

Valley Center continued its perfect season in the championship game, dumping Nickerson, 68-63, Andale's varsity won the third place game by popping past Winfield, 56-48, and Maize swamped Wellington, 70-45, in the game for fifth place.

Wellington knocked Mulvane into the seventh place game Thursday night, Dec. 15, when the Crusaders poured past the Cats, 69-60.

Mulvane was under the gun against the Andale jayvees, a position Mason called a "no winner."

"It's one of those situations you get into," said Mason. "It's a ball game, yet you're playing a junior varsity bunch that has nothing to lose and everything to gain. If you win, you're supposed to beat them, and if you lose, you feel terribly about it."

Tournament officials had trouble filling one slot in the eight-team field and settled for the Andale jayvee. "It counts as a win and that's about it," said Mason. "I understand the problem Maize had but it still was a tough situation for us. Anyway, at this point, we'll take a win against anybody."

"This point" is 1-4 this season so the victory snapped a four-game skid by Mason's troops to begin the season.

The Wildcat staff also used the occasion to unveil a new offense. "We decided to go back to the basics," said Mason. "We have been having trouble getting a good shot off on offense and that's why we switched offenses. Not too many people are going to play us zone until we can beat their man-to-man."

The change seemed to help as the Wildcats played well to nail down third place by 16 points. "We were getting too mechanical, getting stuck on one side and decided to try something different and it seemed to give us better scoring opportunities by freeing up some people."

Mason was pleased with the way his club responded to the new look--and also the pressure of playing the junior varsity. "We shot the ball fairly well," said Mason. "They came out in a zone and didn't cover up (Larry) Lambrecht early. He knocked down a few in the first half before they went to a box-and-one. We played a lot better, more consistent. If we could have played like that, we would have beaten Wellington. We have to find five people who can play consistently, but anytime you win, it's a step in the right direction. We still have a lot of things we have to do.'

Lambrecht, who was named to the all-tournament first team, finished with 28 points against Andale. Sean Gillespie was second-high for the Cats with 17 points. Center Jeff Sisco scored seven points and Bruce Brashear scored six.

Wellington moved out smartly against Mulvane and the Cats never caught up. The Crusaders held a 23-12 lead after eight minutes and were ahead, 41-27, by intermission.

"We gave them too many easy shots early," said Mason. "They shot only 47% but a lot of them were uncontested layups off our defense. That's another reason we went back to the basics."

Lambrecht had another big night, scoring 21 points, the 6-foot, 4-inch Sisco scored 13 points and Gillespie scored 12. Bill Harrington had his best
