## 'Broom' Out For SB Girls

The "broom" was in the other hand Monday night, April 13, at the Mulvane sports complex, and the Mulvane Wildcats were doing the cleaning.

Coach Charlie Mason's Cats, after taking it on the chin in three straight double-header sweeps, took a pair from Douglass. The Wildcats won, 7-2, in the first game, then rallied in the 2nd inning of the second game and pulled away for a 15-6 verdict.

"We needed those," said Mason, whose team is now 2-6 on the year. "We made some great defensive plays, had some timely hits, and you can't say enough about Terri Holman coming in and shutting them down in the second game. She won both games. She pitched well, but more importantly, she threw strikes and our good defense came up with the big plays."

MHS put together back-to-back three-run innings in the opener to take charge. Holman gave up only two hits and also went 2-for-3 to spark Mulvane at the plate. Heather Pearman broke out of a hitting slump with a two-run triple in the second inning.

In the nightcap, the Bulldogs jumped out to a 5-1 lead after nine outs had been played, but the Wildcats put together four walks in a row to start the frame and some key RBI hits by Heather Taylor and Stacy Taylor to regain the momentum and the lead.

Mulvane added two three-run innings in the 3rd and 4th innings to put the game away as Holman relieved Stacy Taylor in the second inning and stopped up the Bulldog offense.

Amanda Meairs had a two-run double in the 4th inning and went 2-for-2 and scored four times in the nightcap. Both Stacy Taylor and Heather Taylor had two hits in that game, too.
