The Wildcat girls couldn't hold off a last-inning rally which saw Bluestern score two times to take a 7-5 verdict, eliminating the Cats.

Rose Hill captured its first regional softball championship ever by blanking Bluestem, 8-0, in the title game. The Rockets moved into the first place game with a 6-0 decision over Douglass in its first-round game.

This is the first year the Kansas State High School Activities Association (KSH-SAA) has separated 4A schools into a playoff of their own. In previous years, there was a 6A playoff and a 5A-1A championship. This year, the KSHSAA is sponsoring state meets in 6A, 5A, 4A and 3A-1A.

"Our regional game was disappointing," said Wildcat softball coach Charlie Mason. "We didn't hit the ball like we needed to hit it. We talked about scoring runs in every inning, and we did get off to a good start, but we didn't sustain it."

The Wildcats jumped out to a 3-1 lead after one inning but the Lions scored four times in the fourth, then snapped a 5-5 tie with two runs in the top of the last inning to win it.

"It was a pretty good ball game, we were right there to the end, but we couldn't answer them in the bottom of the seventh," stressed Mason. "That makes it two years in a row we've been beaten by their pitcher."

pretty good pitching performance by junior Heather Pearman, who had given up only five hits going into the last inning. As is usually the case, a one-out walk started the winning rally. A single and a sacrifice fly followed to score one run and a single brought in another tally.

The Cats, who ended the season with a 6-15 record, started the game with a two-out rally in the first. Heather Taylor, Deva Lewis and Marianne Smysor all walked to fill the bases, and Pearman and Lee Cates both walked to force in two runs.
