## Wildcat Softballers Catch Fire

The Mulvane High School softball girls rang up three victories in their four games last week, capping the rain-plagued week with a doubleheader sweep of hapless Douglass Tuesday, May 3.

Coach Chartie Mason's Wildcats zapped Douglass, 27-1, in the opener behind the sparkling pitching of Jamie Wilson, who fired a one-hitter, and edged the Bulldogs, 4-2, in the nightcap, with righthander Susan Wenger spacing six hits.

Coupled with a split of a twinbill against Goddard Monday, May 2, that left the Mulvane record at 5-10. The Cats won the first game at home against Goddard, 6-5, and lost the second game, 5-3.

"We didn't have much trouble with Douglass in the first game," said Mason. "Douglass really helped us out. Twenty-seven runs on seven hits. There were 24 walks and three batters hit, so it wasn't much of a ball game. We did start to hit the ball much better though, and that was the encouraging thing about the series. Plus, we played solid defense. We made only one error in the two games."

In the opening game, Mulvane scored seven runs in the first inning and by the third, it was 12-0. End of contest.
