In the opener, Wilson struck out six and allowed only three hits before tiring in the seventh. Mulvane scored three times in the first an RBI triple by Spatz and a couple Circle miscues. Spatz had another RBI in the second inning which gave Mulvane a 5-1 lead. Mulvane made the most of only three hits in the game as the T-Birds gave up 14 walks.

Cates came up big in the Andover series with three triples and four RBIs in the sweep. Both Wenger and Wilson also pitched well, Wilson idling in with a six-hitter and Wenger giving up only one run after a three-run Trojan first inning.

The next step for Mulvane is the Mulvane Class 4A Regionals which will be played at the Mulvane sports complex next week. The Wildcats will tangle with Wellington at 4:45 Wednesday, May 17, in a semifinal game.
