"We're not playing very good right now," said Mason. "We're scoring runs but we're also giving up too many runs. Defensively, we didn't play well. Until we stop beating ourselves, we're going to struggle. I think we'll get there but we need to make the plays in the field."

In both games, the Wildcats came within an eyelash of winning. In both games, they had the bases loaded in the last inning but didn't deliver the big hits.

Hitting standouts in the first game for the Cats were Valeri Larson with two hits and two RBIs, NiChelle Bruce, Gemi Spatz and Lindsay Kendrick with two hits each and Jamie Wilson with two RBIs. Mulvane started its season by trading 8-6 games with the Trojans at Andover Thursday, March 28. Andover won the first game, Mulvane snapped a 6-6 tie with two in the last inning and Wenger stopped Andover in the final inning to preserve the win.

"We had two pretty good ball games," stressed Mason. "One of the strengths we have to have is our defense and I was disappointed in our defense in both games. We made quite a few errors in each game. The good point, though, is that we were in position to make the plays but just didn't. Our pitchers did a pretty good job putting the ball in play but our defense let us down. We didn't make the plays."

Mason felt the Cats could have swept the Trojans if they would have been better at hitting in the clutch. "We left 10 runners on base in the first game and nine in the second," pointed out Mason. "We can't afford to not
