The Wildcat girls were trying to return to the Class 4A State Softball Tournament last week in the Haven 4A Regional but instead, the Cats found out that No. 1 seeded Clearwater was no laughing matter as the Indians nudged Mulvane, 3-2, Wednesday evening, May 19, to advance to the 4A State Tournament this weekend in Manhattan.

"We never could get the big hit when we needed it," confessed MHS Coach Charlie Mason. "We left seven runners on base. You can't take anything away from Clearwater because they got it done when it counted."

Mulvane scored first and had hard-throwing Kassie Hargrove on the mound. In fact, Hargrove and her relief, freshman Sara Simpson, yielded only four hits but Clearwater bunched three of them in the 5th to score all three of its runs. In the 2nd, Ashley Wirths reached on a walk and scored when Hargrove banged out a single and an error gave Wirths the plate.
