Sara Simpson won the second game by spreading eight hits and giving up only one earned run.

McColpin started the game with a solo home run and veteran Aubrey Benjamin scored to make it 2-0 in the second inning when she singled, went to second on a passed ball, took third on an error and scored on a ground out. Freshman Kayla Linnebur walked to start off the third inning and McColpin's single moved her to third. A ground out by Doerfer brought the runner in for the eventual winning tally. Doerfer walked and scored on Vanderhoof's single in the 6th, and Simpson did the rest, retiring nine of the last 11 hitters.

"Anytime you can get a split with Valley Center, you're doing something," said Mason, "We have a lot of new players and it's going to take time to get things turned around. We just didn't play to our ability against Oxford. We're going to have our ups and downs and hopefully we can gain from those situations."
