It's a trick question because they never have...that is, until Monday evening. April 21, at Goddard. The Wildeat, rebounding from a twin loss to Maize in their last outing, rallied in both games and saw the Lion mystic melt away with a 2-1 victory in the opener and a 5-3 decision in the nightcap.

That sweep kept the Wildcat hopes alive in the Chisholm Trail League race. Coach Charlie Mason's girls have an 8-4 record overall and a 7-3 mark in the league

"We played a couple of pretty good games," said Mason. "It's been a long time since we beat Goddard once let alone taking both games in a doubleheader. The good thing about it is that we got some production from some people where we haven't been getting it and that we came from behind in both games."

Mulvane waited until its last at bat to take game No. 1, and also left it to winning pitcher Dani Phillips to win her own ball game.

Trailing, 1-0, in the top of the 7th, the Cats rallied for two runs. Catcher Katelyn Carson singled to start the uprising in the 7th. Sara Clasen walked and both girls moved up a base on a wild pitch. Pinch-bitter Hannah Benvin and Abby Sorensen both popped out before senior Melissa Doerfer beat out a swinging bunt that scored pinch-runner Morgan Stoll. Phillips' shot to the outfield for a single plated the winning run.

"Dani won her own ball game," said Mason. "She pitched a really good ball game, then got the big hit to drive in the winner. It was nice to see us getting the clutch hitting and coming from behind after Goddard had scored a run in the 6th inning. Just last week against Maize, we weren't able to get the lead run on base and get her home. The girls worked real hard on that against Goddard."

And they also played spotless defensively behind Phillips, who spaced four hits and didn't walk a batter as she improved her record to 5-1. The MHS defense had only a couple of errors that proved not critical.

In the nightcap, another comeback was a welcome achievement. The Lions punched in two runs in the 1st inning to take the lead but Mulvane came back in the 4th with a pair of runs to take the lead for good, 4-2.

"Shayna Duncan settled down in the second game after that first inning and pitched a great ball game," said Mason. "She was a little shaky in that 1st inning. She didn't have her best stuff the whole game because she walked a couple and hit one batter. I felt it was an excellent test for her to be able to pull it out when she didn't have her best stuff.
