## Famous Feuds' Ends With Split Games

All of those match-up are rivalries of nearly unmatched intensity. And when Mulvane's Wildcats and Rose Hill's Rockets tangled in softball Monday night, April 28, it was the usual tooth-grinding operation.

The Wildcats handed Rose Hill the first game on a silver platter but the Cats came back in the second game for a series split in a Chisholm Trail League Division I battle

The Rockets took advantage of three Mulvane errors in the 7th inning to rally for a 5-3 victory in the opener but Mulvane had righthander Shayna Duncan in the nightcap and a 5-0 verdict.

"It was your typical Mulvane Rose Hill games and we've played a bunch of then, over the years," pointed out MHS Coach Charlie Mason. "We had the first game handed to us by Rose Hill in the top of the 7th inning but we couldn't handle it and gave it right back to them. If we could have played a little better defense, we could have taken both of them. Dam (Phillips) pitched a good enough ball game to win it but we just didn't hold it together on defense. They got a hit, then we made three errors and two unearned runs scored to end the game."

The split left Mason's Cats at 9.5 and Rose Hill at 5.7 for the year

Phillips was sailing along until Rose Hill-took a 3-1 lead with three in the 4th. The

Cats went ahead, 4-3, with a pair of 7th inning runs. Stephanic fatum reached on an error and was sacrificed to 2nd by Abby Sorensen. Melissa Doerfer singled for one run and with two outs. Duncan ripped a base hit to score Doerfer. But the lead was short lived as the Cat defense collapsed in the 7th.

That ruined a tine game by Phillips, who didn't walk a batter and issued eight hits

"I really kind of underestimated Rose Hill," said Mason. "They hit the ball as hard as anybody we've played all season long. In fact, they out hit as in both games."

Duncan had her hands full in the mightcap but hung in there to get the shutout despite giving up eight hits as RH threatened six of the seven innings.

The turning point, though, came in the 5th inning when Rose Hill had the bases filled and no outs. One runner was out when she interfered with Doerfer catching a ball at shortstop and that kind of took the steam out of the inning. No runs were scored as the Cats protected a 4-0 lead.

Kayla Linnebur carried the big stick for Mulvane. She knocked in two runs with a one-out double in the 5th. Duncan went 1-for-1 with one run scored and Sara McKnight scored a run.

Mulyane charged to the lead in the opening inning when Doerfer singled, stole second and scored when Katelyn Carson lined an RBI base hit. The lead went to 2-0 when McKnight scored on an error in the next inning. The Wildcats added an insurance run in the 6th when Sorensen walked with two outs and scored after two stolen bases on an error by the catcher.

"It's amazing how sometimes one play can make a difference but that interference call just took them out of a big inning," said Mason. "After that, Shayna didn't let them get anything going."

Mulvane's softballers will have one series this week. They'll go to Andover Central today (May 1) for a make-up doubleheader before coming home Thursday, May 8, for a big series against Valley Center. Those games begin at 4 p.m. at the sports complex.
