The Mulvane softball team is heading into a key stretch of the season on a four-game winning streak.

The Wildcats traveled to Towarda Monday, April 17, and swept host Circle in a doubleheader, 4-0 and 13-4. Mulvane improved its record to 6-2 overall, including 1-1 in AVCTL Division III.

"We started out slowly offensively in the first game," said Wildcat head coach Charles Mason. "We were able to put some hits together late, and Whitney Phillips had a dominating pitching effort. We were able to jump on them early in the second game, and we took advantage of some errors and wild pitches. Courtney Maples and Christy Hartley had a solid game pitching, and we were able to overcome some mistakes in the field."

The opener was scoreless until the sixth inning. Tara Roberts led off with a single, went to second on a wild pitch, and scored on a single by Amy Phillips. Three batters later, Kourtney Bell drove one deep for a three-run home run and a 4-0 lead. Whitney Phillips took over from there, pitching a three-hit shutout, walking one and striking out 15.

In the nightcap, Mulvane scored four runs each in the first two innings. The Wildcats added four more runs in the sixth, highlighted by a solo homer by Whitney
