The undefeated visitors cut loose with 14 straight points in the third quarter, holding Mulvane without a point in that period.

"They hit a couple of shots early in the third quarter and that's when we needed the leadership," said Dennis. "I was happy to be down only by 10 points. We didn't shoot the ball but we played good defense in the first half to stay close. Twice, we had the ball with a chance to cut the lead to single digits and we didn't score either time. Everybody got their heads down and they started rolling. That's when we needed to have someone step up and get the team going, but no one did."
