One Step At A Time And Cat Girls Running

One step at a time is what Mulvane High School girls basketball coach Jayson Miller is aiming for and his Wildcat girls finally hit the bulls-eye Tuesday night, Jan. 11. In fact, it was more like the mother lode!

The Wildcats played their best-ball of the year when talented Circle came to town for a Chisholm Trail League Division II game. The Thunderbirds were fresh from their most impressive showing of the year, dumping highly regarded Kingman. They left Mulvane wondering what hit them as the Cats played four solid quarters in a 47-42 victory.

The win elevated Coach Miller's expectations and gave the Cats hopes for a brighter day. The MHS girls improved to 2-1, in the league and 3-4 record overall with possibly the biggest win in Miller's two-year stint.

"It was a big win because they were coming off of beating Kingman Friday night and Kingman is one of the best if not the best team in the league," noted Miller. "It was big for our girls if they wanted to try and step up to the next level."

The Cats took charge in the last quarter as sophomore center LaShelle Parker kept banging 'em home under the basket. Natalie Turner hit a couple key free throws and Kim Mangus made a block on defense what kept the T-Birds from tying the score in the final minute.

"Those were all big plays," agreed Miller. "We had the lead but Circle took it back with a couple minutes to play but those three plays just turned the game around. Turner was 4-for-5 in the 4th quarter and LaShelle scored nine points to key a nice little run for us in the last two minutes. And they got the hall inside right under the bucket but Mangus made the block that kept them from tying the game and we came back down and took it inside for a four-point lead."

That was really the ball game as a Parker bucket with 35 seconds left put the Cats ahead 46-42. Parker finished with a gamehigh 18 points. Mangus finished with six and Turner and Kari Leonard scored six apiece. Arin Leonard had three points.

"It seemed like they were up the whole ball game but we made a nice run at the end to take it," said Miller. "We were taking care of the ball and sticking to our philosophy. We wanted to get the ball inside to LaShelle and she did a great job of finishing it up."

Miller's general game plan was to switch defenses on Circle and the plan seemed to keep the Thunderbird girls off-balance. "We did a lot of switching and we forced some turnovers because of it." said Miller. "We also cut down on the number of turnovers we had been having, too. We had scouted them against Kingman and thought we had


