The Cats held the lead much of the way but Circle made a mad dash at the finish line, making it 38-38 with less than two minutes remaining. As the T-Birds pressed

to get the ball, Richards slipped behind them and took a pass for a lay-up and a 40-38 lead but with less than a minute left, Circle tied it with a jumper. Richards answered that call with a free throw, and the Wildcats had another free throw with less than five seconds left but missed it. Circle could manage only a half-court shot.

Richards finished with a team-high 11 points but there were plenty of scoring accolades to go around. Guard Lindsay Kendrick scored seven points and frontliners Kristin Buchanan and Leonard pitched in six apiece. Shiriah Craft and Kassie Hargrove scored four points each.

Circle had too much for the Cats in the Jayvee game, winning by a 36 23 count. Top scorer for Coach Dale Landes' MHS Jayvees was Aubrey Benjamin with eight points. Freshman LaShelle Parker had her best game with seven points.
