The Cat offense got untracked at home against Goddard Friday night, Jan. 15, but still fell as the Lions registered a 63-54 triumph.

"We put up a lot of shots, The girls finally played with a lot of emotion and intensity which has been lacking in the last two games. The girls came out and wanted to play hard against Goddard."

Mulvane fell behind by as many as 11 points in the final quarter but surged back to within two points with almost three minutes-left in the game.

Gehring scored eight points in the final quarter and finished with 13 points. The junior Cole led all local scorers with 15 points and sophomore Debbie McIntyre scored her varsity career high with 12.

The Wildcat junior varsity hiked its record to 2-5 by nailing Goddard, 44-24, with perhaps their finest game of the season.

Guard Debbie Plain scored 11 points and Lisa Swayne and Gwen Reekie each added eight for the Cats of coach Leah Fairchild.
