Diamonds Not Best Friend'

Diamonds may be a girl's best friend but a diamond press didn't receive a lot of smiles from the Mulvane High School girls Friday night, Jan. 16.

It was Winter Homecoming and Goddard was in Mulvane for the occasion. Using a diamond press that the Wildcat gals couldn't solve, the Lions roared out to a huge lead and coasted to an 58-42 triumph in a Chisholm Trail League game.

The game ended "Endurance Week" for the Cat girls. They played the best two teams in the CTL back-to-back. Buhler manhandled the Wildcat girls, 56-25. Tuesday might, Jan. 13, in Buhler.

"They are definitely the top two teams in our league," emphasized Mulvane Coach Jayson Miller. Ilt was a good week for us as far as playing hard and seeing where we're at but we definitely faced two good teams. Goddard used its diamond press (a I-2-1-1) and they are very aggressive with their front four They got off 13 shots before we even took one. That tells the story right there."

The Lions bolted to a 21-5 lead after one quarter and expanded the margin before the Wildcats started finding their way. Ironically, that 16-point margin built up early is what Goddard beat the Cats by.

"We have looked at that press in practices but the speed is one of those things you can't get in practice," added Miller. "You can't simulate that same speed. I don't think we got the ball across half-court for the first three minutes of the game. After that, we settled down and played even with them but by that time, the game was basically decided. They got a lot of deflections that disrupted our offense."

The Wildcats came out of the halftime dressing room and made a small dent in the lead by scoring three consecutive buckets but couldn't get much closer the rest of the way. "I was really proud of the girls just hanging in there after that early spurt," said Miller, "We still have to find a way to get better against their pressure. Once the initial shock was over, and especially in the second half, we did that.

"We wanted to play at our pace and our pace is a lot slower than theirs but when you get to going out there, it's hard to stop and go back to being deliberate. That's one of the purposes of the pressure defense."

Miller also was happy with Mulvane's play after intermission. One of the Cat problems this year has been a third quarter swoon. "We actually made up some ground when we came out of the locker room," said the MHS coach. "We had good energy and the girls started working the ball but I think Goddard didn't mind trading baskets since they were ahead."

Seniors Abby Sorensen and Shayna Duncan highlighted the offensive punch for the Wildcats. Each scored 12 points. Josey Gosch finished with nine points and Stephanie Tatum scored three.



After one quarter, Buhler had a 12-4 lead but things went downhill in the second half as the Crusaders out-gunned the Wildcats, 31-11, after intermission to remain unbeaten in the CTL.

"It was pretty much ditto at Buhler," said Her. "I wouldn't mind watching that game when Buhler and Goddard play. We came out and bang, it was 6-0 before we could blink an eye. Buhler ran up and down the floor. They have a lot of speed. Their transition game really hurt us."

The Wildcats were hurt by no balance on offense. Only four players scored with Duncan leading the charge with 10 points. Sorensen finished with seven points, Whitney Becker scored six and Gosch had two.
