Girls Prep For Trophy

A sticky defense inside and a dominating board game got the Mulvane High School girls off and running Monday, Jan. 22, in the first round of the annual Mulvane Wildcat Girls Classic.

Coach Gregg Wolgast's Cats throttled Andover, 43-22, to begin their quest for the school's first tournament championship in its own tournament.

Other first-round games found No. 1 seeded Garden Plain rebounding from a 10-0 deficit to take the Derby junior varsity, 59-50; Circle hit 11 out of 12 4th quarter free throws to hold off Wellington, 51-48; and Winfield sizzled past Clearwater, 64-38. (See pairings for tonight's action.)

The Wildcats, faced with their first real chance of winning their own tourney, pulled away from Andover with a steady game featuring a strong defensive game keyed by the inside defense of junior Kendra Banzet and and total domination on the backboards. "It was one of those games where you play just good enough to keep yourself out of trouble," emphasized Wolgast. "We played good enough to win. We didn't shoot the ball well but our defense carried us. Kendra had a tremendous ball game inside. The lane was her territory. She must have blocked seven or eight shots and did a great job on Andover's top scorer (Ketchel Stephenson). "Stephenson was held to only two points.

The Cats' domination on the boards was thorough, too. With junior Ticia Nicholson pulling down 14 caroms, Lisa Heersche grabbing nine and Banzet getting six, the Wildcats owned the boards, 40-22, often getting several shots each time down. The Cats finished with 17 offensive boards.

"That was a big factor, too," said Wolgast. "We didn't shoot the ball that good. Both Ticia and Tammy (Withrow) had off nights shooting the ball but we got the rebounds and put them back in. We got two or three shots at it all night long."

The game belonged to the Mulvane defense, though. If Banzet wasn't putting her stamp of approval on her territory, guards Tricia Turner, Withrow and Heersche and senior Nicole Infinger were buzzing around the court keeping the Trojans off-balance and befuddled.

"Our pressure defense in the second quarter got Andover on the run," said Wolgast. "We had some steals and at least two 10-second calls on them. It really bothered Andover." And that's when the Cats started pulling away after playing a 10-9 first quarter.

Banzet finished on top of the scoring charts for the Wildcats, hitting 16 points. Heersche scored in double figures for the second straight game with 10 points. Nicholson scored seven points and Tumer scored six.

The Wildcats took another step toward a contending position in the Chisholm Trail League Friday night, Jan. 19, when they punched the lights out for winless Wellington, 49-34, with a fine showing.

The victory marched Wolgast's Cats out to 4-2 in the CTL and definitely kept the Cats in the thick of things along with Valley
