Girls March nto Semis

. When the bell sounded to start the Mulvane Wildcat-Wellington Crusader game Monday night, Jan. 22, in the opening round of the 21st annual Mulvane Wildcat Girls Classic, both coaches could have headed for the lunch room for dinner.

"Both teams had a pretty poor first half," pointed out Jayson Miller, the MHS cage coach. "I think both coaches could have taken a dinner break or something. There was just a lot of sloppy play."

Heck, there were only seven points total scored in the third quarter--please pass the catsup.

Mulvane snapped out of it in the second half, though and ate up the Crusaders in the last five minutes for a 42-31 triumph to move into tonight's championship semifinal against Garden Plain. The two will meet in the featured game at 7:45 p.m.

Garden Plain powered past Clearwater, 45-34, in the other Monday night opener. Arkansas City upset Andale, 45-38, in the first game Tuesday night, Jan. 23, and Campus plastered Andover, 51-32.

"It was a tale of two halves," said Miller of the opening round victory. "It was only 13-12 at halftime. We came out about as flat as you can come out. We stood around and didn't move. We weren't taking bad shots, we just weren't taking any shots. Everybody was standing around looking for somebody else to do something."

After Miller's lunch break-er, halftime, the Cats, who snapped a three-game skid with the victory, started piecing things together. They took the lead for good by out-scoring the Crusaders, 16-10, in the 3rd quarter and pulled away down the stretch behind some clutch free throwing. Jackie Burkhart slammed down two tosses in a row and Melissa Doerfer hit a pair to keep the Crusaders reeling in the final two minutes.

"Those were big and gave us some breathing room down the stretch," said Miller. "And I think Kris Lazar got behind them for a lay-up. They were in the hunt until late in the game. Wellington was trying to pressure us to get the ball back but we slipped a couple people behind them for long passes and an easy bucket or two."

Doerfer had a fine outing, scoring 12 points. Sami Booth and Lazar each finished with nine points, Burkhart scored five and reserve Andrea Valerio had four.

"We're happy to get a win," added Miller. "We've played hard the last couple of weeks and don't have anything to show for it, so we needed this one.'

The Wildcat girls finished the toughest stretch of the season so far but had nothing to show for it except the experience of three straight defeats against outstanding foes. The latest came Friday night, Jan. 19, when a topranked Buhler squad hit town. The Wildcats and Crusaders battled in a tight one until the final minutes when Buhler pulled away behind a flurry of free throws for a 63-42 Chisholm Trail League road victory.

For Buhler, the win was No. 9 in 10 games this season. "Buhler is a great team," admitted Miller. "I thought we came out and played hard. It was kind of frustrating, though, because the score was a lot more than what the game was all about. It was a lot tighter until the final minutes when we were trying to foul to get the ball."

The Crusaders connected on 14 of 15 free throws in the 4th quarter to pull away.

"We did a good job, better than the last couple of games," added Miller. "I thought our offense looked better."

The Crusaders came out on a streak, blasting off to a 9-0 start, but the Wildcats, with Booth and Parker each hitting six points, had that gap closed to 20-15 by the first quarter mark. And Mulvane pulled to within four (38-34) in the third quarter by holding the Crusaders to only two points
