## Girls Bottom Out At Valley

Being perched on the edge of respectability bothers Bill Stinson, Mulvane High School's girls basketball coach. "Every time we get to the point where it looks like we've got a shot at being one of the top teams, we play a poor game," said Stinson.

At Valley Center Tuesday night, Jan. 29, one of those 'poor games' jumped up and bit the Wildcats, allowing Valley Center's young club to take a 35-30 triumph. The loss saw Mulvane's record dip to 6-7 and to 3-2 in the Chisholm Trail League.

"It was an important game for us," said Stinson, "because we could have been right there second in the league with a shot at Buhler. Instead, we didn't prepare for the game and shot poorly (13 of 51 from the field). It was the worst shooting we've had all year. We had good shots but didn't get the job done. They also ran a 1-3-1 half-court trap and we turned it over too many times."

And in the end, it boiled down to another lousy free throw shooting game, as the Cat gals made only four of 14 from the stripe. "It was a frustrating loss, one that we could have won," stressed Stinson. "We should be able to hit free throws. Probably six or seven that we missed were at the front of a one-and-one, so we missed an opportunity to get six or seven more points. You're not going to win the big games if you don't learn to hit free throws. It's that simple."

Stinson started the game hoping to put the defensive crimps on VC and the Wildcats did that. However, Mulvane's 30-point effort was the worst of the season for a team averaging 48 points a game.

The Cats were led by senior Melody Carey, who scored nine points. Lori Cox and Lisa Jones added six points apiece. Hot-shooting guard Tiane Dossey was held to only four points after having a string of double-figure games.

The Mulvane junior varsity had its own way against the Hornet jayvees, rolling to a 42-22 victory.

Rhonda Davis was the only player in double figures but three other players—Terri Plotts, Tanya Gerdes and Susie Quigley—had good games with eight points each.

Stinson's guard tandem of Dossey and Jones continued to sparkle but a mystery at the free throw line did the Wildcats in the annual Mulvane Girls Invitational Tournament which ended Saturday, Jan. 26, in the Mulvane High School gym.

The Wildcats wound up 6th in their own eight-team meet as Rose Hill muscled past them, 50-46, in the consolation championship game, using a 6-for-15 game at the free throw lane to cash in the victory.

In an earlier game, the Wildcats survived a stubborn Augusta, 55-46, Friday night, Jan. 25.

"We played good basketball but lost it on the free throw line again," complained Stinson. "I'm not so disappointed with the loss because Rose Hill has a very good team. We rebounded and played well after playing poorly against Augusta the night before."

The outstanding offensive display by the guard duo of Dossey and Jones continued to light up the boards. Jones scored 12 points and Dossey had 11 against the Rockets. They had ample help as senior Melody Carey scored seven and Darla Reekie finished with six.

Cox also led the team in rebounds with nine and Carey had eight.

Against the winless Orioles from

Augusta, the Wildcat gals couldn't shake away until late in the game as Jones dumped in 12 of her 16 points in the second half. "You try to come right out and put a team like that down early, get on top, but we really didn't play well and that enabled them to stay in the ball game against us," said Stinson.

Dossey led the team against Augusta, pouring through 17 points. Jones finished with 16 points, six coming in the final quarter when she hit 4-for-5 from the free throw stripe to help keep Augusta behind. Mulvane's No. 3 scorer was Carey, who tossed in nine points.
