

MHS Girls Successful In Opener

Mulvane threw its man-to-man offense out of neutral into drive in the final half and slowly pulled away from Rose Hill in its opening game of the 4th annual Mulvane Girls Invitational Monday night, Jan. 30, in the MHS gym.

"I feel we grew a little as a team because when we needed it, we got it together and made it happen," said Coach Bill Stinson. The end result was a 39-34 come-from-behind to march into the semifinal match-up against No. 1 seeded and undefeated Derby at 7:45 tonight (Feb. 2). Derby mowed down Augusta, 55-20, in its first-round game.

The championship game will be at 8 p.m. Saturday, Feb. 4, with the third place game at 6:15, following the pom-pom competition scheduled to start at 5 p.m.

Stinson was pleased that the "shoe was on the other foot." "For a change, they made the critical mistake and we capitalized on it," said Stinson, pointing to a Rose Hill error in the final moments when the Rockets lost the ball on a five-second infraction when a player forgot to help bring the ball in-bounds. "We scored a bucket on that and went up by four points. That was a big play."

The Cats, now 5-7, out-scored the Rockets in the final period, 13-7, with a reserve Lisa Jones doing much of the

damage with six points.

Overall, the Wildcats were paced by senior Tawnya Infinger's 12 points and eight more by sophomore Lori Cox.

In a league game last Friday, Jan. 27, Goddard held on as Mulvane staged a second-half comeback for a 55-46 decision despite being out-scored 25-20 in the final 16 minutes.
