Mulvane senior guard Melissa Doerfer played her way into the spotlight and onto her first all-tournament team Saturday, Feb. 1, when she was one of an odd combination of girls named to the 23rd Mulvane Wildcat Girls Classic All-Tournament team.

The team is selected by participating coaches and tournament officials contained four seniors, three juniors and three sophomores, had two repeaters and had a Patry on it for the fifth consecutive year.

Tournament champion Andale, Clearwater and Campus dominated the top 10 team with two players each Doerfer was joined on the team by seniors Tracy Patry of Andale, Tiffany Adams of Campus and Kryssy Jennings of Arkansas City. Sophomores Lindsey Davis of Wellington, Amanda Reyes of Campus and Kristi Love of Clearwater

Juntors were Keesha Steckline of Garden Plain. Ali Steven of Andale and Adrienna Thompson of Clearwater

Patry was selected all-tourney for the third consecutive year and Reyes was selected for the second year in her sophomore year. The Patry name has been on the all-tourney team since Nicole Patry of Campus was a tournament selection in 1999 and again in 2000. In 2001, Nicole made it again and so did a sophomore named Tracy Patry of Andale.

Several other awards were presented at the conclusion of the fournament. Andale coach Mark Kerschen won the Coaches Award, Clearwater won the Sportsmanship Award and the UV Hartung Award to the girl demonstrating the best sportsmanship, hard work, hustle, team work and loyalty went to the Andale senior Patry play a little better Offensively, we've been gaming confidence every game and I think the girls have all finally gotten on the same page. The MHS girls got off to a slow start, trailing much of the 1st quarter but Ricked

"But I felt like the girls were working hard but didn't have the intensity that we have had in recent games. We got it going in the 2nd quarter but then came out like we were asleep again in the 3rd quarter."

The Mulyane girls played a strong 4th quarter and pulled away. "Neither team shot well in the 4th quarter but we did force some turnovers and we also kept them off the offensive boards," emphasized Miller. "They got one shot and we got the rebound. That's only the second time this year that we have won the battle of the boards. We also beat Andover on the boards in the semifinals."

Junior Shayna Duncan led the way on offense for Mulvane, scoring 10 points. Becker, starting her fourth game, finished with nine points and guards Melissa Doerfer

and Abby Sorensen scored eight and five points, respectively.

In Thursday's semifinal, Miller feels the Cats played the best five-minute stretch of the year. "We started playing assertive ball and for about five or six minutes; we attacked them," said Miller. "We put pressure on them and our full court press forced them to do a lot of things they didn't want to do 1'm sure it was a fun game for the girls because they got to do to Andover what other teams have been doing to them this year."

The Wildcats ended up forcing 30 tumovers out of the Trojans. "That gave the girls a lot of confidence in our full court package," added Miller, whose girls outscored the Trojans, 30-16, in the middle two quarters to take control of the game.

Doerfer had 20 points, her biggest output since early in the season. Duncan scored 10 in the paint. Becker hit for six points, Stephanic Tatum had five and Ireshman Lira Roberts scored four.

The Cat girls will host Augusta in a league game Friday night, Feb. 7, before turning their attention to a Rose Hill rematch at Rose Hill Tuesday, Feb. 11


