

Mulvane Girls Fumble Chances

Up and down it goes. Mulvane girls basketball coach Bill Stinson has to check his schedule each week to see if he's feeling great or down in the dumps.

It was "down time" Tuesday night, Feb. 5, as Stinson's Cats were out-classed, 66-46, by Andover in a non-league game.

"I can't explain it," said Stinson. "We just weren't ready to play. They've got a nice ball club but there's no way they should have beaten us by 20 points. That's what it boils down to, we weren't ready. The total game was out of whack. We were missing lay-ups, giving away the baseline and not screening off on the rebounds.

"It's been like that all year long, we'll be up one week ready to play and the next, we'll be down," concluded Stinson.

It was definitely a downer after one period Tuesday in the Mulvane High School gym. The Trojan gals zipped out to a 22-11 lead at the end of one quarter and by halftime, had built up their eventual winning margin.

figures, scoring 11. Guard Lisa Jones finished with seven points and reserve Terri Plotts finished with six points.

The Wildcat jayvees won their second close game in a row. They rallied to topple Andover, 49-45, after falling behind, 15-6, in the first quarter. The Cat jayvees out-pointed the Trojans, 14-6, in the last quarter to wipe out a four-point Andover lead.

Frontliner Tammy Haas led the Mulvane scoring with 12 points and Plotts and Sheila Mahlandt each added nine points. Susie Quigley was next with six points.

The Cat gals squared their record (7-7) for at least a game Friday night, measuring Augusta, 54-46, in a Chisholm Trail League Division I game at Mulvane. The victory boosted Mulvane's loop record to 4-2.

"It wasn't anything spectacular but we played some good ball," said Stinson. "We played a solid, no-frills game. We played good defense but couldn't put Augusta away because we missed a lot of shots in the paint."

The Wildcats nearly broke the game open early as they marched out to an 11-4 lead in the first quarter but the Orioles rebounded to move close at half, 27-21.

Carey finished with a game-high 17 points and Jones was next with 12 points. Guard Tiane Dossey scored 10 points and reserve Rhonda Davis finished with seven points.

The Mulvane junior varsity held off Augusta to record a 47-45 victory. Coach Tony Gourlay's team made four straight free throws down the stretch to hang in there.

Terri Plotts gunned in a career-high 17 points, 10 coming in the third quarter. Tammy Haas and Tanya Gerdes each finished with nine points and Sheila Mahlandt scored seven.
