

# Revenge Factor Goes To Rose Hill Girls

A season sweep just wasn't in the cards Tuesday night, Feb. 6, as the Mulvane High girls travelled to Rose Hill for a Chisholm Trail League game.

Mulvane's only win of the year came in early January against the Rockets but memory is sometimes a wicked thing to have. This time, Rose Hill dumped the Cats, 62-48.

In the junior varsity game, Rose Hill squeaked past the MHS jayvees, 40-32.

"We couldn't beat their press this time," said Kelly Dennis, the Mulvane girls coach. "We had about a two-minute spell in the second quarter that led to about an eight-point turnaround and that hurt. We have a hard time against the press at times."

It also hurt that Mulvane's inside game, junior Dannelle Hughes and senior Janelle Wenke, got into early foul trouble because that enabled the Rockets to apply more pressure to the guards, making it even more difficult to lob the ball inside to Hughes and Wenke. Hughes scored 10 points to keep the Cats in the game in the first quarter but scored only four more the rest of the game.

Rose Hill sprinted to the lead behind a 21-6 explosion in the second quarter and put the game away in the third period with a 19-7 advantage.

Hughes finished with 14 points, Wenke scored eight and reserve, Valerie Larson, scored nine. Carrie Burkhardt had seven and both Crissy Carpenter and Michelle Fowler scored five points.

For the Mulvane jayvees, Shelley Richards led the way with 10 points while Rachel Rose, NiChelle Bruce and Melissa Buchanan had four apiece.

It was a rocky start but the MHS girls played much better and actually made a game of it Friday night, Feb. 2, during the Mulvane High Winter Homecoming game against Kingman.

Coach Dennis' gals had to settle for a 54-35 defeat but the Cats hung in their right with the Eagles most of the second half before Kingman pulled away in the final quarter. The first two quarters were devastating. The Eagles were ahead, 17-7, in the first quarter and out-scored the Wildcats, 7-1, in the second period.

"That's kind of like the whole season has gone," emphasized Dennis. "We played good defense throughout but we have trouble scoring. We just couldn't hit anything and that kept us from getting anything going against them. Normally, we have one girl who is on but in the first half nobody could hit."

After intermission, Mulvane fell down by 20 but rallied to get it to within 12 and
