Augusta trounced Mulvane in the junior varsity game by a 22-11 count. Top scorer for the Wildcats was Valerie Larson with five points and Jamie Martin with four.

Mulvane's Courtney Renfro, a sophomore, led all scorers with 18 points. Sophomore Janelle Wenke pumped in 11 points. Senior Cody Watson had six points but the team's usual scoring leader, Lee Banzet, was held to only three points.

The difference, though, was at the line. The Crusaders, who are on top in Division I, made 13 of 19 free throws, including nine in the last quarter when the game was on the line.

"It was a great performance for your girls," declared McMahon. "Wenke really played good offensively and is improving on defense. Watson made some key rebounds for us and in the last quarter kept us in there by making four of five free throws and Renfro came though with some good shooting from the field."

Although Mulvane trailed much of the game, they still were hanging around, staying close. McMahon went to the trap press and the Cats had to foul late in the game in an attempt to get the ball back. "I guess we fouled the wrong people," said McMahon, "but in that situation, you have to foul and they made their free throws. They shot nine of 12 in the last quarter and that was the ball game."
