Slumping Cat Girls Beaten Big Twice

It all started five games ago against Valley Center and Mulvane High School girls basketball coach Bill Stinson hopes it ends against the same team. The Hornets started a slide for the Cat girls back in January, a slide which took a turn for the worst Tuesday night, Feb. 12, at home against Wellington.

Wellington popped loose in the final period to bury the Wildcats, 64-37, to all but kill Mulvane's hopes of finishing second in the league.

"We need to find out what's gone wrong," said Stinson, whose club has lost five of its last six games and dropped to 7-10 for the year and 4-4 in the league. "We only hit 20-some percent from the field and they shot around 50%, so that's one area. We're getting the same shots as we did earlier this year but their not falling."

Senior Melody Carey finished with 13 points for Mulvane and Lisa Jones added 10 but they were the only Wildcats in twin figures. Darla Reekie was next with seven points.

The Mulvane junior varsity, however, roasted the Crusaders with a furious 4th quarter blast, 52-48, out-scoring Wellington, 24-9, in the final frame with Terri Plotts scoring eight of her 11 points in the last quarter and Susie Quigley scoring six points.

Guard Tanya Gerdes led the jayvees with 12 points. Plotts and Quigley were next with 11 and eight, respectively, and Sheila Mahlandt finished with seven.

The Wildcat gals ran into a buzzsaw Friday night, Feb. 8, at Buhler. The highly-regarded Crusaders punished Mulvane, 73-40, in a Chisholm Trail League Division I game.

The win solidified Buhler's claim to the No. 1 spot in the CTL. Mulvane is in a battle for second place.

Stinson said his strategy early-on was to pack a one defense tightly inside, forcing the Crusaders to shoot. "All they did was make about six or seven straight to start the game," said Stinson. "We're definitely going to forget about that one. If we can win all three remaining league games, we'll finish second."

For Mulvane guard Lisa Jones, a innior, scored 12 points to key the team's offense. Seniors Melody Carey and Daria Reckie, junior Tlane Dossey and sophomore Terri Plotts each scored

six points for the Wildcats. Buhler also pasted the MHS junior
